When children exhibit challenging behaviors, the problem is often localized within the child. However, behavior is complex and seldom centers around one reason. Research shows, in order to gain a meaningful understanding of student behavior, there must be a meaningful understanding of adult behavior and the context in which all these behaviors occur. This workshop looks beyond the child and helps educators reflect on their own behavior, contextual elements, interactions and classroom variables that might contribute to challenging behaviors.
